

- **Heating Pipe burst in Annex** - Sometime on Sunday January 12th a pipe burst in the "Annex" (the storage area connected to the garage) causing extensive water damage. To say the least, it was not the nicest of things to discover at 10 pm. at night as I returned from meetings! *What a mess!* I was very lucky that Harvey Quackenbush rushed right over and the two of us began to bail out the annex. The plumber who arrived sometime after midnight began shutting things down to repair the busted rad pipe. Thank the Lord, no water entered the rectory. With Harvey sent home and the plumber completed his job about 3 am - I was glad to see the day done.

The insurance company was informed early that Monday morning and our adjuster had a clean-up and repair crew here within the hour just before our funeral. They were able to place the contents in the garage, and began minimizing any further water damage. As of this bulletin printing the restoration of the room has about a week to go and our Maintenance and Decoration Committees will be able to begin to use this area again. As with any insurance claim, there is a deductible and with our diocesan policy that fee is \$1,000.00. The repairs covered by insurance will far exceed that amount.

I want to express my sincerest thanks to:

+ Harvey Quackenbush who came out in the bitter cold at 10 pm. that night and worked really hard with me until about 2:30 am. Harvey also re-appeared the next day to make sure things were okay and that the repair crew was organized and working.

+ Ray Albert who also came over the days following the flood to ensure that things were going along smoothly and to offer any assistance that he could. Ray, Harvey and myself also worked together, along with our heating contractor, as valves in each rad in the church, hall and rectory were replaced and the furnace running smoothly. This job was long overdue and so we took the occasion to complete it while the furnace had to be shut down and restarted.

+ Cathy Gomm, Jennette Barton from the Environment Committee and those who assisted in removing all the church décor and maintenance items from the annex and safely stored them in the garage. Once again, Thank you, thank you. From *Fr. Jim*

Guest speakers include: **FREE OF CHARGE**

Brenda Cunningham who has a chronic lung condition and is in the process of planning her end-of-life care. She will share her first-hand account of her own journey.

Sr. Costanza Romano, Team Lead, Spiritual and Religious Care, St. Joseph Centre, who will provide the audience with some of the emotional, spiritual/philosophical and family dynamic considerations when planning end-of-life care.

Lise Mason-Poratto, a lawyer with expertise in the field of medical consent and end-of-life care who will provide guidance on legal considerations that must be addressed.
